

How to Teach Your Child About Diversity and Inclusion

- 1. Lead by example: Children learn by observing the behavior of the adults around them. Show your child how to be respectful, open-minded, and inclusive towards people who are different from them.
- 2. Discuss differences: Encourage your child to ask questions about differences they observe in others, and help them understand that everyone is unique and special in their own way.
- **3. Read diverse books:** Read books that showcase a variety of cultures, families, and experiences. This can help your child understand and appreciate diversity.
- 4. Teach empathy: Encourage your child to put themselves in someone else's shoes, and to understand and respect others' feelings and perspectives.
- **5. Encourage respect for all:** Teach your child to respect all individuals, regardless of their race, ethnicity, religion, gender, sexual orientation, or abilities.
- 6. Encourage self-reflection: Encourage your child to reflect on their own experiences and biases, and to continue learning and growing in their understanding of diversity and inclusion.
- 7. Model inclusive language: Use inclusive language and avoid language that may be offensive or hurtful to others.
- **8.** Address biases and prejudices: If your child expresses biases or prejudices, address them openly and respectfully, and help them understand the harm these attitudes can cause.





T is for...Tooth Brushing

Oral health is a key part of your child's overall health and well-being.

To help you ensure your child has healthy, strong teeth to last a lifetime, make regular tooth brushing a part of their daily routine.

Children should brush their teeth using fluoride toothpaste every morning before school and every night before bed. Remember that most children need help brushing their teeth until they can tie their own shoes.

Check Your Child's Hair



You know the routine - it's that time of the year again. Check your children's hair at least twice a week, remind them not to share combs, hair bands, hats, scarves, and call the school if you notice a problem. Remember too, that if head lice is detected, you also need to treat your entire house - bedding, upholstery, any clothing that is pulled over the head, and anything that comes in contact with the hair. It's a big job, but it's necessary!
